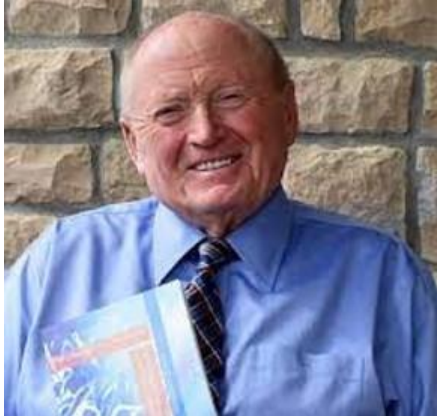


### Opening Keynote: Speaker Lee Lambert

#### THE FUTURE OF PROJECT MANAGEMENT IS NOW



A PM career wasn't always a career. It was once a hobby that technical people did in their spare time. How did we get from hobby to career, and what's next? In this presentation, Lee Lambert shares the experiences of someone who has been through it all. More than 45 years of involvement in PMI has exposed the good, the bad, and the ugly. We have gone from basic project scheduling to comprehensive, integrated project planning to an Agile explosion, and we aren't done yet since AI is expecting to change everything (again).

Lee R. Lambert is considered throughout the world as one of the project management profession's thought leaders. He has been spreading the PM word for over 50 years, was one of the Founders of the PMP and is recognized by PMI as one of only 70 PMI Fellows. Lambert has implemented four enterprise-wide project management information systems and his work in developing High Performance Teams has been judged a miracle. He has prepared and delivered user training to thousands of employees, and his value-add consulting and training, has been instrumental in creating successful PMOs to drive rapid implementation., and provided "public" training programs for more than 50,000 professionals in 23 countries.

### Closing Keynote: Speaker Annalise Jennings

#### THE 5 PRINCIPLES OF 'COMMUNITY'

In this keynote presentation, Annalise Jennings will review the core principles that will help the project management 'community' recover from an environment of problems, fear and retribution to one of possibility, generosity and gifts. Using a case study, she will demonstrate that both team leaders and team members can generate trust, reciprocity, information flows and quality social cooperation by coming together in unity for the good of their organizations.



Sociologists call this overall concept "Social Capital", the idea that we all derive individual, collective and economic benefits from the connections we build within our social networks. Annalise's work suggests that cultural change can be brought about through consent and connectedness, as opposed to mandate and force. In doing so, we can build social capital and contribute to the higher goals of our society. This presentation promises to be a stimulating capstone of the day's events at the conference, and culmination of the Annalise's wisdom and knowledge that we can all implement now and well into the future.

Annalise Jennings is a business and community strategist with a background in risk management and 25 years' experience in Corporate Banking. Over her career she has specialized in projects that focus on transformation and maximizing human potential. She is the founder and principal of Dynamic Exchange, committed to supporting individuals, teams, communities and organizations to reach their fullest potential. She has worked extensively with Australian Indigenous communities and is the creator of Whole of Community Change – a blueprint for economic development and social change, designed to bring about community ownership and self-determination.
