Keynote Speakers

<u>David Harvey</u> – Reaching New Levels of Success at Southwest



David presented a wonderful history of Southwest Airlines and how Southwest Airlines through Portfolio and Program Management practices established its five strategic initiatives (i.e. AirTran Integration, All-New Rapid Rewards, fleet modernization, introducing the Boeing 737-800 aircraft, and new reservation system with international capabilities) driving its 2015 Company Plan and through Change Leadership delivered the value needed to continue to return industry-leading results. Today, in its 44th year, Southwest is as strong as its ever been, achieving record profitability and being the top performer in the S&P 500 in 2014. The foundation laid over the last five years unlocked tremendous future growth for Southwest to reach its vision of becoming the World's Most Loved, Most Flown, and Most Profitable airline.

Michael Arms The Business of Saving Lives: Bringing together Marketing, Social Media, Public Events, and Collaborative Efforts



Michael (Mike) Arms presented two unique Helen Woodward Animal Center programs that show ways a company can bring together marketing, social media, public events and collaborative efforts with multiple organizations that give life to a program and make it grow. Mike Arms discusses the process of creating an original concept and campaign for a program, and the associated challenges to growing and marketing it.

His inspiration story started in New York in the 1960's. He took a position at the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA). However, the stress of seeing the horrors that humankind perpetrated against the animals of New York quickly became too much for Mike, because the ASPCA, itself, was killing over 140,000 innocent animals a year at that time. He gave his

resignation and with just six days left on the job, Mike got a call that there was a dog hit by a car in the Bronx. He drove to the accident scene and found the dog with its back broken. As Mike bent to lift the injured puppy into the ambulance, some men attacked, beat, and stabbed him. As he lay in the street bleeding and unconscious, the little dog who should not have been able to move, crawled to Mike's side to lick him awake. It was an epiphany. Mike said to God "Let me live, and I promise you, I will do everything in my lifetime to protect them." Mike has kept his word.

Andy Crowe - Motivating Project Teams to do the (Im)possible



Andy Crowe, Founder and Chief Executive Officer of Velociteach, explored the topic of motiving project teams to operate at their peak performance and achieve results that would otherwise be impossible. In his high-energy and content-rich style, Crowe weaved existing motivational studies with cutting edge behavioral research to unlock how project managers can harness the underlying motivation of individuals and teams. By exploring such topics as contingent, intrinsic, and extrinsic motivators, managers were exposed to techniques they can immediately put into practice to help their teams operate at peak performance, transforming the impossible into the possible.

<u>Davidson Frame</u> – Talent Management: A Strategic Imperative – Focusing on Effective Use of People to Achieve Successful Project Outcomes



David Frame examined the strategic value of talent management and development. It pulls from research conducted by PMI®, Human Systems International, and the Economist Intelligence Unit on the importance of using appropriate talent on projects. It demonstrates how talent deficiencies hamper strategy implementation, reduce project and program success rates, and impact the bottom line negatively. It also illustrated the disconnect between human resources and executive leadership, offers an example of an organization that does it well, and suggests directions on where organizations can improve. Finally, it provided clear direction on what organizations can do to improve their talent strategy to increase their project and program success rates.




